# **NEW BEGINNINGS**

"And he who was seated on the throne said,
'Behold, I am making all things new.' Also he said,
'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy
and true.'" Revelation 21:5

As we move into a new year, it gives us an opportunity for assessment and for goal-setting. We may look back on 2017 with nostalgia... or we may look back on 2017 with relief that we got through it... or we may look back on 2017 with grief or disgust or disdain for things that happened to us over the course of the year. Looking ahead to 2018 may bring excitement and anticipation for what the new year will have to offer... or looking ahead to 2018 may bring anxiety and worry about things known and unknown in the coming days, weeks, or months... or looking ahead to 2018 may also bring grief as we move into this new year having suffered loss or unwanted change.

The reality is that the turning of a new year is an arbitrary mark on our calendars. January 1 is no different than any other day of the year. The date itself holds no special promise nor looming curse. However, the turning of the new year has traditionally been a moment of reflection and a time for "resolutions" to make positive changes in our lives.

As God's people, every day provides this same opportunity. We go to bed each night, looking back on the previous day with nostalgia, relief, grief, disgust, or disdain. This is our opportunity to lay it all at Jesus' feet and ask forgiveness, give thanks, and seek strength and wisdom. His Word provides us grace, hope, and provision for a new day. Ideally, having laid it all out, listening to His Word, and reflecting on His voice to us and our situation, we go to bed prepared for a new day.

Then when we awake, we look ahead with excitement and anticipation, anxiety and worry, or grief. But again, *ideally*, we ask forgiveness, give thanks, and seek God's strength and wisdom for the new day. We rest in the promise of our baptism – namely, that we are

made new in Christ. The Holy Spirit dwells in us and daily transforms us more and more into God's image. We daily fail and fall. We are broken and injured. But we are also God's "workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

Luther's Morning and Evening Prayers provide a great reminder for us as we go to bed at night and awake in the morning, as well as closing one year and beginning a new one...

#### Evening

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

#### Morning

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

May the Lord mightily bless your New Year and each New Day He gives you in His grace.

### UPDATE FROM THE TREASURER

Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy 2018! As we embark on the New Year with optimism about what lies ahead, we realize there will be moments of great challenge as we move forward. Thankfully in these times of trial, we know that our Lord will lead and guide us. With the New Year, Faith's budget requires evaluation and recalibration to account for programs that we continue as well as exploring new opportunities.

In December, the Congregation approved a budget that increases nearly 6% year-over-year. Below are two charts that were distributed during the voter's meeting. The first breaks down the two largest components (Salaries & Mortgage) and the second summarizes the anticipated expenses for 2018.

The following is a summarized list of notable changes to the 2018 Budget:

- The Elder's approved a 3% increase for Pastor Mike and Beth Monsell (Church Secretary).
- "Technology" as an expense category was added to aid in upcoming tech expenses such as website design and IT Support.
- Under "Christian Growth", an expense for Group Fellowship was added. This accounts for a quarterly luncheon similar to the Reformation luncheon that was held in October.
- A number of "Church Property" line items (Gas, electricity, septic, Trash, etc) were increased slightly to account for cost adjustments that have occurred over time.
- Council approved the increase of remuneration for live musician's (Organist, violinist, etc) from \$50 to \$100 which is closer to market value of a private musician.

I ask that you prayerfully consider your personal giving situations as you review your personal budget as well as Faith's budget above.

## **BIBLE STUDY UPDATES**



#### MIDWEEK BIBLE STUDY

The Wednesday morning Bible Study will begin meeting again on Wednesday, January 10, 2018. We will be studying the Life Light study of Selected Psalms, learning about the various types of Psalms written by inspired authors. Some are calls to the Lord for

help, many are Psalms of praise and thanks, there are calls for God's mercy and forgiveness. Several Psalms ask God to judge those who have wronged the psalmist. He is trusting God to judge rightly, but let's God know that he feels wronged. Some of the Psalms rejoice in the worship of God in His temple, some look forward to the coming Messiah who will reign as King. The final category of psalms are known as wisdom Psalms, encouraging God's people to look to Him and His word for help in all situations. Psalm 119:105 states "Thy word is a lamp to my feel and a light for my path." Telling us that God's Word will give us guidance in every situation.

Each of the 9 week studies will look at about 4 Psalms. All are welcome and we hope you will join us at 10:00 am on Wednesday beginning on January 10, 2018. Please see Judy Andela for lesson materials or call at 410-996-9748

## SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

For the month of January, Pastor Thress will be leading the following bible study...


In The Bible On Trial: Beyond A Reasonable Doubt, the case is made that the Scriptures are authentic, dependable, God-inspired and worthy-not only of our full attention but of our complete faith. In this Bible study, attorney Craig Parton leads the viewer through relevant points that comprise this important discussion. He asks, "Is this book, the Bible, and its contents-reliable?"

This question has been fiercely debated for centuries-and rightly so. If the Bible is not worthy of our faith, if it is riddled with errors, if it is full of inconsistent and false information, then knowing that up front is vital in forming a decision about it. If, on the other hand, the Bible stands up to critical scrutiny and academic investigation, if it shows itself to be a trustworthy record of historical events and God's dealing with man, then its all-inclusive promise to sinners of salvation through the blood of Jesus Christ makes it the world's most important book.

In four sessions, The Bible On Trial: Beyond A Reasonable Doubt addresses critical views of the Scripture, examines evidence from the ancient world, surveys how archaeology often corroborates the Biblical record and considers the word of those who were either Jesus' contemporaries or were closely connected to eyewitnesses who knew Jesus -and His remarkable life-well.

This Bible study features expert testimony from Dr. Paul Maier of Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, Mich.; Dr. Randall Price of Liberty University, Lynchburg, Va.; Dr. Jeff Kloha of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Mo. and Joel Lampe of The Bible Museum, Goodyear, Ariz.


## Basic Facts of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League
