HAPPY NEW YEAR!!

As we begin a new year, I always appreciate the transition away from the "Holiday Season." As much as I love Christmas, by the time we have gotten from Thanksgiving, through Advent, to Christmas, and into the New Year, all sense of "normal" is gone. All the regular routine has been set aside for the hustle and bustle of the season.

Now we are just entering the season of the "Sundays after

Epiphany." This season resembles the season of the "Sundays after Pentecost", which takes up about half the calendar year. It even shares the familiar liturgical color of Green.

These liturgical seasons are sometimes called "ordinary time", which feels very fitting after the "not so ordinary time" of the holidays. As a pastor, this is a time to take a breath before the season of Lent kicks off. Easter is a little late this year, so Lent doesn't begin until March 5. This means we get almost two months of "ordinary time" as we begin this new year.

This doesn't mean that we are idle, but this time provides a balance. I think of Jesus when He finds time to go off by Himself to pray and rest. God created rest from the beginning when He created the world in six days and then rested on the seventh. He commands us to "remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy." Both work and rest serve an important purpose in our lives.

The New Year often means making "resolutions." But how often do we consider "rest" as something that we resolve to do. Biblical rest – Sabbath rest – includes spending time in God's Word, praying and studying, as well as physically and mentally resting. Our minds, bodies, and spirits need time to pause and renew.

As I said, we are not idle as we spend this "ordinary time" in January and February. We continue to worship together every Sunday. Bible study continues on Sunday mornings between our worship services. The midweek Bible study resumes next week on January 23rd at 10AM.

And as we worship and study together in this "ordinary time", we reflect on Jesus' ministry. We watch our Savior as He serves, cares, and teaches. We experience the grace of God as we watch His story unfold, leading us in this "ordinary time" to see His *extra*ordinary work that leads us into Lent and to Easter, to the cross and the empty tomb.

YOUR 2024 DONATION STATEMENT IS AVAILABLE!

ICON, what is it? ICON is a software system to centrally collect all membership data: full names of each member of your family, address, phone numbers, birthdates, and email address. ICON also allows us to enter attendance each week. This is why it is important to let us know you, and your family, are worshipping with us. Please be sure you sign in at the podium located by the sanctuary doors. The attendance is also important to let us know: who we haven't seen in awhile, and check in on them; to accurately know how many confirmed members we have for synod reporting requirements; and to track one time and frequent visitors. The last component to ICON is the recording of your donations. And yes, your 2024 donation statement is available and you have the ability to download it yourself!

To print your 2024 donation statement: (if you have a login name setup already)

- 1) From your browser, enter <u>www.iconcmo.com</u>
- 2) Select LOGIN from the tabs at the top.
- 3) If you are asked for church's phone number, enter 302-834-1214, your login name, and password.
- 4) Please take the opportunity to check your family's personal information for accuracy and update if necessary. If you prefer not to provide your birth year, simply enter 0000.
- 5) To print your statement, select the Donations tab from the top of your screen. Enter the date range of 01/01/2024 12/31/2024 and select print.

<u>If you do not have a login name setup</u>, please email the office at *secretary@faith-lutheran.church* and request a membership portal link. Once you have your login name set up, you can follow the directions above.

We understand this is a new way of receiving your statement and encourage you to give it a try. If you do not have access to a computer or would prefer a printed statement, you may request a printed copy from the office.

Thank you for your patience and understanding while we transition towards fully implementing ICON and all of the available features. 


TRUNK or TREAT — WHO HAD MORE FUN????
