COLOR CHANGES

It's that time of year when the colors of nature change into beautiful reds, oranges, and yellows. Since this newsletter covers the rest of our year through December, it makes me think of all the liturgical color changes that will take place in church as well.

For the past several months we have been in the long green season of the Sundays after Pentecost. We spend about half the calendar year with green on the altar during this long post-Pentecost season as well the post-Epiphany season. But over these final months of the year, we finally see the colors change. So let's consider these seasonal colors and what they mean.

- The Green of our post-Pentecost season reminds us of growth. During this season (as well as the season of post-Epiphany), we watch the ministry of Jesus unfold and hear letters (epistles) written to congregations of the early church to encourage their spiritual growth.
- ❖ The Red of Reformation Sunday, which is our first color change at the end of October, harkens back to the Red of Pentecost Sunday and the tongues of flame appearing on the disciples as they received the Holy Spirit. On Reformation Day, we give thanks that the Holy Spirit has continued to inspire, lead, and direct His Church from that Day of Pentecost, through the days of the reformers like Martin Luther, all the way into His 21st century Church.
- The White of All Saints Sunday (1st Sunday in November), Christ the King (last Sunday of the Church Year toward the end of November), Thanksgiving, and Christmas, as well as Easter, calls to mind God's holiness and His gift of our salvation and declaring us holy. It reminds us of our baptism where our sins were washed away and calls to mind the image in Revelation where the great multitude gathers at the throne of God, wearing white robes that have been washed in the blood of the Lamb.

- The Blue of Advent is a color of Hope, a central theme of Advent. It calls to mind the blue waters of Baptism and the blue sky that makes us think of heaven, eternity, and the presence of God. In the season of Advent, we celebrate God's presence as we prepare for Jesus' birth at Christmas, God's great gift of His full presence Emmanuel, God with Us.
- Purple (Violet) is the one liturgical color we won't see until after the new year during the season of Lent. It is a royal color, reminding us of Christ, our crucified and risen King. But it is also a symbol of preparation, which is why it can be used for Advent, as well as repentance and mourning, strong themes of Lent.

I find great joy in considering all that the colors of the Church Year symbolize. These visual reminders are meant to draw us into worship and to reflect on God's presence with us in His Word and Sacraments. As we display these various colors over the next months and throughout the year, I hope you will consider what they mean as we worship our faithful God and Savior in every season.
